### **Ethical, Legal and Professional Issues in Couples Therapy –Dr. Butch Losey**

This workshop will consider common legal, professional and ethical issues in couples therapy. This interactive discussion will include a review of couples research and what it tells us about professional efficacy and effectiveness. Ethical and legal considerations will include role changes, the appropriate use of no-secret policies, process for guest attending sessions, intimate partner violence and business practice. Several examples of documents will be handed out that you can immediately use in your practice.

### **Ethical Practice and the Criminal Justice Population –Dr. Steve Patrick**

Not all counselors engage in the counseling profession with the desire to work with individuals that are involved with the courts and or criminal justice system. However, given the nature of clinical work and the focus on change, it is inevitable that nearly all counselors will have a client at some point in their career that will be involved with the CJ system. Participants in this workshop will explore ethical considerations when the clinician is faced with a contact with the CJ population.

### **Ethical Decision-Making for the School Counselor –Mr. Vince Rahnfeld & Ms. Donita Jackson**

Not all ethical issues need immediate determination and can evolve over time. Often in school settings, ethical situations develop as the various shareholders become involved, including teachers, administrators and others, who may not necessarily adhere to our own ethical standards and may sometimes not understand the need for these. These situations and others will be presented for group discussion.

### **Facilitating Healing, Resiliency, and Hope: Trauma Responsive Care**

**Mary Vicario LPCC-S**

Trauma is now recognized as a near universal experience of individuals with behavioral health issues often resulting in a complex array of social, emotional, and behavioral challenges. Through understanding of the latest trauma research and careful translation into practice, we can help trauma survivors experience healing, resiliency and hope.

This training coordinates trauma informed care into a framework that can be used by anyone working with victims of trauma. It includes the three stages of positive trauma resolution (re-experience, release, and re-organize) and the five resilience factors found in people who move beyond their traumatic experiences.

Trauma's effect on brain chemistry, development, and relationships are explored, and since trauma is processed and stored in nonverbal parts of the brain, expressive, relational and sensory based will be identified to benefit clients of all ages and ability levels.

Service plan goals and objectives will also be presented to assist in bringing this treatment to your current work.

*Mary Vicario is a Licensed Professional Clinical Counselor Supervisor (LPCC-S) and a Certified Trauma Specialist with over 30 years' experience working with trauma survivors of all ages and ability levels and training on trauma informed care nationally and internationally. She has been a People-to-People delegate to China and Mongolia with the American Counseling Association and guest lectured and participated in a conference on human trafficking in Germany.*
